Obstetric Module 1: Assessment and Management bleeding in the first trimester of pregnancy [Last updated 28th February 2013]

Subject Topic	Assessment and Management of the patient presenting to the Emergency Department with bleeding in the first trimester of pregnancy

Simulation learning objectives	 Approach to the woman in early pregnancy presenting to the emergency department Assessment of vaginal bleeding Exclusion of ectopic pregnancy Diagnostic testing in early pregnancy Management of miscarriage and ectopic pregnancy.
Target Group	Nursing and Medical Students and Junior Staff
Delivery method	Power point presentation followed by simulated learning with actor patient.
Timeframe	60 minutes
Resources for session	Telephone number for SCSSC (or local faculty if available) so that participants are able to phone the appropriate services as needed Telephone number for host site so that Rhesus D status can be given over the phone to the participants Any information leaflets that are available in the host ED. 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Timing	Welcome and Introduction	Resource
5 mins	 Welcome and Introduction Provide Housekeeping – Fire Exits, mobile phones on vibrate Provide a summary of what the workshop will involve and the expectations from the participants Introduce yourselves - facilitation team, host team and participants. Include experience of cardiac patients If this is not the first module run on that day, the participants are the same and this has been covered previously, then this section can be missed out. 	Video conferencing unit Enough seats for the participants and arranged in a horseshoe facing the VC unit and camera. Led by the team over VC but with host team supplying information on the fire exits/toilets/etc.
Timing	Main Topic Presentation	on the fire exits, tonets, etc.
20 mins	Power Point presentation on Bleeding in Early Pregnancy	PowerPoint presentation

Timing	Familia	iarisation to Simulation	
5 mins	boIncIf t	troduce students to concept of the simulated patient, including role playing, safe examination and bundaries discussed with the faulty actor prior to the session. clude discussion about location of telephones and how to perform investigations. to use manikin - Introduce students to mannequin & capabilities, including difficulties with ommunication over distance.	Local faculty to familiarise the students to the environment/ mannequin/actors. Can use the familiarisation video, to guide the local faculty, if needed.

15 mins	Participant Briefing You have been asked to assess Flora MacDonald who is a 27 year-old primipara, who presents with vaginal bleeding.			
	Scenario outline			
	Flora is 5 weeks pregnant in her first pregnancy. She presents to the ED with PV bleeding. The scenario focuses around communication with			
	Flora, organisation of appropriate care and follow-up. Flora's observations remain "stable" throughout the scenario. She is distressed and			
	worried. A focused history, examination and investigations should be performed.			
Timing	Debrief			
10 mins	Key clinical issues:			
	Structured approach to the patient with PV bleeding – Stable Vs Unstable			
	Abdominal examination in early pregnancy			
	Knowledge of blood tests to take from a patient with early pregnancy PV bleeding			
	Key non technical issues:			
	Communication with patient – information about causes of PV bleeding, potential miscarriage, EPAS/GP follow-up, vaginal ultrasound			
	Arrange for the patient to visit EPAS/GP the next day as per department protocols.			
Timing	Summary			
5 mins	Assessment of early pregnancy should begin with determining haemodynamic stability.			
	Ectopic pregnancy is a potentially life threatening diagnosis.			
	Expectant, Medical or Surgical treatment may be appropriate.			
	Communicate compassionately with the woman and her partner.			





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
